She became a member of S.S.W.D. more than ten years ago and was deeply interested in its activities; in fact, in the history of the Westcott family. She was also an active member of the Vermont Chapter. She leaves three daughters, Mrs. Frank Jay, Mrs. Hudson Reed, and Mrs. Elmer Carr, two sons, Phillips Henry Wescott and Harold Whitney Wescott, all members of this Society, and 27 grandchildren. The aympathy of the Society is extended to the family and her kin who esteemed her.

WELL-WORTH READING--Before you go to Johnstown, N. Y. and the Mohawk Valley next July to attend the 7th Biennial Celebration of the Westcott Society, get a copy of the National Geographic Magazine for July, 1947 and read the stirring description of the historic section before and during the Revolution. "At Johnstown stands Johnson Hall, the blockhouse-defended baronial mansion of Sir William Johnson, pre-Revolutionary Superintendent of Indian Affairs in most of British North America. The remarkable Irishman is buried in St. John's churchyard in this city he founded and named. Around him stories and legends cluster, though 'Sir Bill' has been dead these 173 years." There are many more like paragraphs in the Magazine; also 24 illustrations and map and 19 natural color photographs. It is all well-worth reading and seeing.
