Westcott, President of this Society, will appoint somebody to carry on the work and also appoint an Editor to continue editing the Westcott Family Quarterly. This will be the last Quarterly to be edited by Mr. Whitman.

WESTCOTT IEIORIAL IN CALIFORNIA--The "Phoebe Canfield Memorial Home" in Los Angeles, Calif., was provided for in the will of Charles P. Canfield, wealthy oil magnate, in memory of his wife who before her marriage was Chloe Phoebe Wescott. She was of the IX generation from the emigrant Stukely Westcott and the III generation from Arnold Wescott of Berlin, Rensselaer Co., N. Y. Phoebe was shot by her former coachman in 1906. The Home was to be used for the education and care of children under twelve years of age.

GIFT OF THIS SOCIETY TO STUKELY WESTCOTT'S CHURCH--At the 7th Biennial Celebration of this Society at Johnstown last July, Leslie P. Westcott, then President, Heit brought folders from Providence concerning the restoration of the First Baptist Church of Providence, of which Stukely Westcott of the first generation in America, was a founder along with Roger Williams and ten others. The matter was discussed and the Society decided to send \$25.00 toward the restoration.

We are also interested in having a plaque made to be placed in the church with a list of the early founders which would include Westcott's name. The National Secretary, Mrs. Ralph D. Trismen, sent the donation for \$25.00 along with a letter. The following letter was received from the church in Providence:

"Dear Mrs. Trismen: Today Mr. Tanner received your letter with its gift to the fund for the restoration of the Meeting House. (A name by which the church is now called.) He deeply appreciates the interest and generosity of the descendants of Stukely Westcott and has asked me to express to you as Secretary of the Society his sincere gratitude. He will pass the check to the treasurer at the ohurch and you will receive from the bank in charge of the fund an official receipt; also later (in 1949) a certificate. Mr. Tanner has asked me, too, to say that he will take up the matter of the plaque with the church officials and they will be glad to communicate with you if ever it is decided to install such a plaque in the church. Please express to the members of the Society the gratitude which will be felt by every member of the committee here in Providence in charge of the fund for the restoration of the Meeting House. Sincerely, (signed) Rose C. Tanner (Mrs. H. B.), Dec. 7, 1948."

(NOTE)--It is of interest here to mention the names of the founders of the church in addition to Stukely Westcott and Roger Williams: Ezekiel Holliman, William Arnold, William Carpenter, Robert Cole, John Greene, William Harris, Thomas James, Thomas Olney, Richard Waterman and Francis Weston. Of the foregoing founders of the church, Arnold, Carpenter, Greene, Harris, Olney and Waterman were ancestors also of many of the posterity of Stukely Westcott.
