My parents are buried there and two Revolutionary ancestors on my mother's side are buried there. Dan Manning and his wife are buried in the cemetery just beyond old "Eagle Tavern" in East Poultney. Stephen de Maranville is buried in the little cemetery in North Poultney, near Hosford's crossing. Both men's names are on the boulder in the Poultney cemetery. East Poultney was the main village before the railroad ran through the town, around 1850."
