Their son, James M. Westcott, born 1866, migrated to Cuyahoga Co., OH where he became a U.S. Marshall. He married Jenni Eggleston, 1896, whose line goes back to the Mayflower's Richard Warren. John Alden, and William Brewster. James and Jenni were the parents of my Dad, Harold E.

He was born 29 MAY 1901, and married Lillian Gilchrist 2 OCT 1920. My birth was 1 JUN 1922, Fairview Village, OH. The family stayed in Cuyahoga Co. until 1940, when I went to Bowling Green, KY to further my education and where I met Doris Finkelton whom I married during World War II while serving in the U.S. Marines. TWO BROTHERS, CHRISTOPHER & SYLVESTER LEFT RHODE ISLAND IN 1816 and 1817. (see Christopher journey account in Jan.'86 Quarterly) AND SETTLED ON TWO HILLTOPS WITH THE SETTLEMENT OF BELLE VALLEY BETWEEN.

A PICNIC SHELTER STAND ON THE SITE OF THE OLD "SYLVESTER" HOUSE. RESEARCH IS CONTINUING AS TOTHE BUILDER OF THE PRESERVED HOUSE.

TAKE EXIT 28 OFF I-77 FIFTEEN MILES SOUTH OF CAMBRIDGE (I-70) AND FOLLOW THE SIGNS TO THE STATE PRHK. THE CHRISTOPHER & SYLVESTER FAMILY CEMETEHIES ARE IN THE AREA. A MAP WILL BE PROVIDED UPON REQUEST. CONTACT BETTY W. ACKER.

ALSO GOING SOUTH ON I-77 BETWEEN MILE MARKER 32 & 33 IS THE SITE WHERE THE NAVY DIRIGIBLE "SHENANDOAH" CRASHED IN 1925. A FLAG FLIES AT THE SITE BUT THERE IS NO PULL-OFF. THE ROADSIDE PARK AT MILE MARKER 38 HAS PICTURES AND INFO.
