I am writing to report the death of my mother, Mrs. Lyle D. Wescott, Sr., who passed away on October 19, 1990 at the Hillhaven Nursing Home in Sanford, Florida. She was eighty years of age.

On another subject, when my wife and I were in England two years ago we came upon a town of Westcott which was a bit to the south and west of Gatwick.
