My wife (Marjorie Haedrich) and I are members of the fine Stukely Westcott Society. We often enjoy visiting England, at least, as often as we are able. Marjorie is originally from Iowa City, Iowa, and I am a native of Brooklyn, NY.

For some years now, we have wanted to write and report a Westcott Barton (or Westcott Farm) just a few miles away from a village called Marwood in the beautiful English countryside.

We naturally wonder if any of the other Westcott Society members are aware of this Westcott (farm) compound? We don't ever recall reading about this in the newsletter, although we could have missed one or more issues when we moved several times.

One significant (and amazing) fact is the date in history that this Westcott farm was apparently established in the early history of England. The date carved on the wood above the front door of this Westcott farm residence was 1068! This certainly goes back into history. My wife and I are not exactly sure (now) whether the date was 1060 or 1068. Before we return to England (and to this Marwood area and the Westcott farm), to take photos, etc; we would be very interested to discover if anyone else is aware of this farm and what is known about its history with regard to the Westcott (Society) families.

While there are no Westcott family members now living at this farm today, it was still an active farm, when we last visited this place. There are several buildings in this very large compound. One building is where pottery is being made and sold in a small storefront area. There is also a large central courtyard area for parking. Marjorie and I had tea, scones & jam inside the large main Westcott farm residence. The family living there were most pleasant & accommodating.

After we hear from you or any other Society members (about this Westcott Barton); we intend to return to England to take a lot of photos and search through a lot more town records. We believe that we can obtain a lot more facts about this Westcott farm in the nearby town of Marwood; perhaps at the church or the cemetery nearby, etc. Our schedule did not permit us to remain in this area very long (that day) on our first trip to this secluded area. We arrived late in the afternoon. On the next trip, we will be prepared to spend the time necessary to do a lot more research in that area.

From Barlow Westcott of Colorado

I am presenting copies of the Westcott History and Genealogy, Vol. I and II to my home town library, the Gilbertsville Free Library of Gilbertsville, New York this summer. This will be in memory of my parents, Clifford J. Westcott and Francetta (Webster) Westcott from Ruth and me and the children.

We thank you, Barlow, and all the others who have given precious family history and family bibles and papers to libraries all over the country. Wonderful collections have been given to local, county, state libraries as well historical societies and genealogical societies. So check these libraries when you are searching for your families. Many libraries are active in the Inter-library loan programs and are connected by computer to large collections in universities and depositories that might have just what you are looking for.

Recently I was browsing in a library and picked up a new book, <u>Rhode Island Genealogical Register Vol. 18</u>, published by the Rhode Island Families Association, edited by Nellie M.C. Beaman, 1995. As I opened a page to Warwick Cemetery Inscriptions collected by James N. Arnold, (original housed in the James N. Arnold Collection at the Knight Memorial Library in Providence) Westcott collateral names jumped out at me...Tillinghast, Greene, Arnold, Mattison, Bennett, Gardiner.

Another one, <u>They Left Rhode Island</u>, <u>Part 39</u>, <u>Early Rhode Island Settlers in Oswego County</u>, <u>NY</u> is abstracted from History of Oswego County, NY copied and abstracted by <u>Dorothy Chapman</u>, a continuing series of her works. And there was Green, Mathewson, Place other Westcott names.

One of the most helpful recent publications is the <u>Abstracts of Pension Application Records</u>. This is not the older book listing application numbers only, this has all the information about the family of the Revolutionary War veteran as shown on the application. Abstracted and published in easy book form. Actually several large books. Available in many local and state libraries.

If you can't find what you need locally consider ordering, on film, books housed in the Mormon (LDS) Library in Salt Lake City, Utah. They do have both of the Whitman books on film. Order through a local Mormon (LDS) Church Family History Center.

They also have the <u>Stukely Westcott Genealogical Bulletin</u> researched by Mr. Whitman and Rachel Wilkins Cottrell, Historian of the Society. It was issued from March 1940 quarterly through March 1949, It was filed with the Congressional Library and dozens of state and local libraries and historical associations so you may find them in your library. An extremely valuable source for corrections and additions to Whitman's work. For example the Sept. 1940 issue corrects the parents of Hannah Gardiner who married Caleb Westcott (dau. of George and Susannah Gardiner, not dau. of John and Mary) and one issue has the family of Laura Westcott who m. Joseph Battease, bringing an entire family from 1824 up to 1939, that was inadvertently omitted from Whitman Vol. II. An excellent source now available to you. Salt Lake City LDS microfilm # 1020771

J. Russell Bullock's <u>Incidents in the Life and Times of Stukeley Westcote</u>, a book frequently quoted in Whitman's books is also in the LDS (Mormon) library in Salt Lake. To see the whole book, on film, order from the local LDS Family history Center on microfilm # 1445919 .

Milford, Otsego County, New York, Justice of the Peace records of marriages from 1802 - 1813 is on LDS microfilm # 0003011, item 19.

The Tefft ancestry: comprising many hitherto unpublished records of descendants of John Tefft of Portsmouth, Rhode Island / compiled and edited by Rev. Charles H. W. Stocking, D.D is on LDS microfilm # 1018920, item 11.
