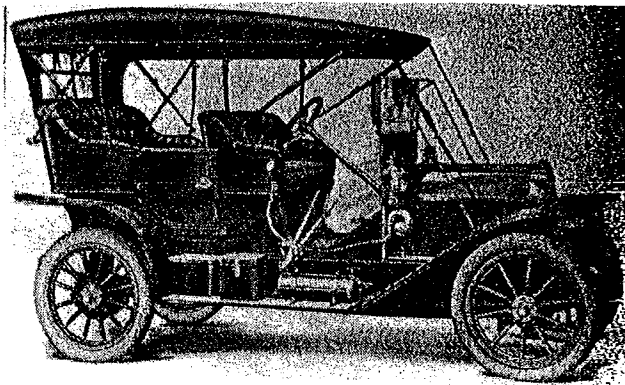

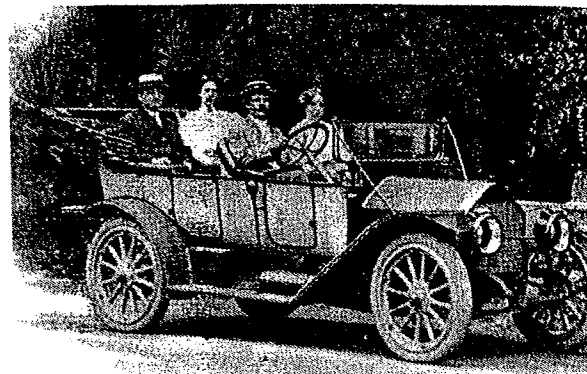

**WESTCOTT — Richmond, Indiana — (1909-1916)/Springfield, Ohio — (1916-1925)** — From the beginning, the Westcott had a good reputation. Though an assembled car, it was thoroughly well built and survived longer than most of its genre. The Westcott Carriage Company had been founded in 1896 in Richmond. In 1909 Burton J. Westcott moved his company into the automotive field, gingerly at first, producing only a motor buggy that year. In 1910 he switched manufacture to a standard four-cylinder 40 hp touring car, and changed his firm's name to Westcott Motor Car Company. According to the March 13th edition of the *Richmond Palladium and Sun-Telegraph* that year, Westcott was building three complete cars a day, and was six months behind in orders. In 1911 a Westcott was entered in the Indianapolis 500, driven by Harry Knight. At half distance it was "running like a watch and well up with the leaders," as reported by *The Automobile*, when, in front of the grandstand, Knight saw the Case car ahead careen into the retaining wall, its mechanic thrown directly into his path. Knight purposely crashed his car to avoid hitting him, and became the hero of the day. In 1913 the Westcott itself was lauded for heroism, following a disastrous flood in nearby Dayton, when the cars were used extensively for relief work and to bring supplies into the stricken area. The first Westcott six was introduced in 1913, and from 1916 on only sixes (Continental engines) were produced. In 1916 the company moved from Richmond to Springfield, Ohio, and the former factory there of the American Seeding Machine Company. Springfield was obviously quite pleased to have the automobile company in town, because in 1921 Burton Westcott was elected mayor. The peak production year for the Westcott was 1920, with 1850 cars built; in 1922 the company emphasized particularly its "Closure" (sedan) model with "Guest Room" — a large car that, Westcott hoped, would not be confused "with the old-fashioned, heavy cumbersome, seven-passenger 'road locomotive'." In 1924 Westcott introduced four-wheel brakes and balloon tires among available options, making these standard for 1925. But by January of 1925 the company was in receivership. Though its assets outweighed its liabilities, Westcott did not have and could not procure the funds necessary to meet debts of assorted supplier firms totaling \$825,000. In March chief engineer J.H. Tuttle left Springfield for Kalamazoo to take on that same post for Checker. In April the Westcott real estate was sold at auction, though the new owners were not allowed possession until September because Westcott had orders on hand and a couple of dozen cars in the process of construction. On January 11th, 1926 Burton J. Westcott died in Springfield at the age of fifty-seven.

Barbara Westcott Reese of California, (whose father, Joseph Uriah Westcott, sold Chevrolet cars for 43 years), saw an article in her local, Herald, featuring the Westcott car. This sparked her interest in finding more about this manufacturer. Which led her to the Standard Catalog of American Cars 1805-1942 by Beverly Rae Kimes and Henry Austin Clark, Jr. She sent the next three pages taken from this book. Thank you Barbara.

# NATIONAL WESTCOTT REUNION DES MOINES, IOWA JULY 26 - 28, 1996



## INFORMATION

**Motel:** Virtually all reunion activities will be at the Comfort Suites Motel, 11167 Hickman Road, Urbandale, IA 50325. This motel is adjacent (easy walking distance) to the Living History Farms. The telephone number of the motel is 1-515-276-1126 (or 1-800-395-7675.) The cost is \$72 per night for a room that may have up to four people for no additional cost. This price includes a real nice breakfast, but if you want the full bacon and egg treatment, there is a very good restaurant next door. The motel will hold 40 rooms for us until June 25th. If you reserve a room at this motel tell them you are with group number 2779.

There are, of course, many other motels available to you. You may wish to use your travel agent, your AAA book, or some other source to arrange for your accommodations. It is highly recommended, however, that you locate fairly close to the Living History Farm area. Camping is available and there are some good campgrounds quite near the reunion site. A nationally known amusement park, Adventureland, is 13 miles away.

**Transportation:** If you are driving, Des Moines is at the intersection of two major interstates, **I-35**, north/south, and **I-80**, east/west. If you are flying to Des Moines, you will probably want to rent a car. If not, let us know about your flight plans on the Reservation form, and we will arrange to meet you. The airport is about 15 miles from the Comfort Suites Motel. If you are walking, start early.

**Directions to Motel:** To get to the Comfort Suites Motel, you should exit Interstate 35/Interstate 80 (that portion of the Interstate where those two roads are combined, and run north and south on the west edge of Des Moines) at Exit 125 so that you are heading east on Hickman Road. The Comfort Suites Motel is within 1/4 mile of the Interstate on the north side of Hickman Road. Turn north off Hickman Road as if you were going into the Living History Farms. The Comfort Suites Motel and the Iowa Machine Shed Restaurant are right there.

## Reunion Events:

**Early Arrival July 25th** The National Officers will probably arrive Thursday. There are no planned activities, but there will be "hosts" available to see that all goes well.

**Friday July 26th** On Friday morning and afternoon we will have a chance to do some sightseeing and will have a fun supper in the evening. There is a lot to see and do in Des Moines and the surrounding area. Several members of the Iowa group will be available to assist you.

The Friday night dinner is casual and should be a lot of fun. Betty Acker, our National Historian is preparing a slide show on the Westcott Automobile. We will follow this with some Westcott memorabilia; facts about Westcott achievements, Westcott products, and even some Westcott interesting family stories. It will all be very informal and we can all join in the fun. We might even have a "jump rope" exhibition by a granddaughter of one of our attendees, and maybe have a little group singing if we feel up to it.

**Sunday July 28th** There will be a special Westcott service on Sunday morning at 9:30 AM in the restored Church in the 1875 Town. This church is just a few hundred feet from our motel.

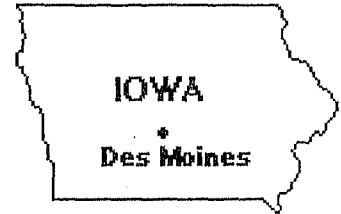

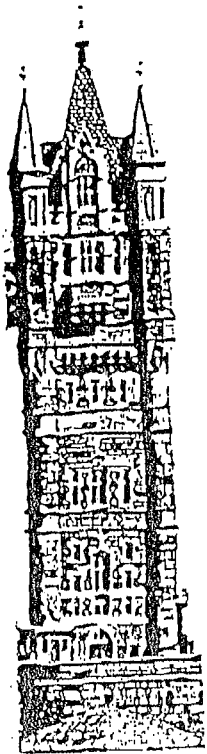

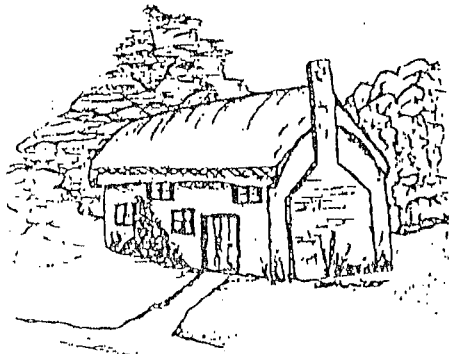
