New English Research on Stukely Westcott

Robin Bush, former archivist of the Somerset Record Office, England, searching primary sources for The Mary and John Clearing House, has found reference to Stukely Westcott in 1607 !!

WESTCOTT, STUKBLEY (a. 1592-1677) of Providence, RI.

Previous searches have located Stukeley Westcott at Yeovil by the time of his marriage in 1619 and the baptisms of two of his children there. Having failed to find him in Devon, Robin Bush had almost given up hope of tracing him. However, in searching the Merriott manor court books (Somerset R.O., DD/TMP, Box 6) for the William Phelps family, a 1607 reference was found to "Stukely Wescot" among a list of adolescents, in a list of inhabitants in 1619 to "Stukeley Wescot and on 24 Apr. 1616 to "Stuckely Westcott" making default of suit to the manor court. The Merriott Bishop's Transcripts contain the following entries for the surname Westcott:

Intriguingly the rare forename "Stukeley" occurs in another contemporary Merriott family. There are three baptisms for children of Stukeley and Margaret Templeman: Peter-15 June 1606, Johanna- 20 Mar. 1607/8 & Edward- 18 July 1613. The origin of the name in Merriott, and thus in both the Westcott and Templeman families, can probably be ascribed to Thomas Stukeley, who occurs as a trustee or agent of the lord of Merriott manor (the Marquess of Dorset) in a copy of court roll dated 17 Oct. 1548.

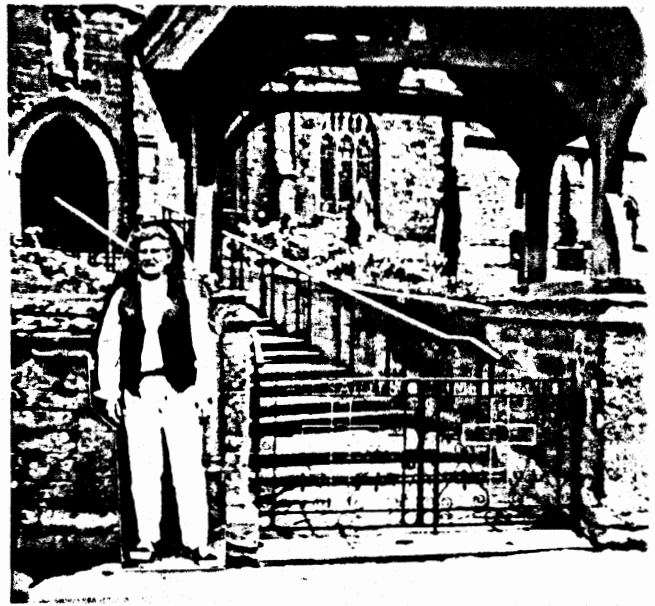
At the West Country Studies Library and Devon Record Office in Exeter, Devon, Robin Bush consulted all available finding aids for Stukeley Westcott or any marriage between a Westcott and a Stukeley. He searched the Burnett Morris slip index, the Diocesan marriage licenses, Boyd's Marriage Index, the Oswin Murray and Olive Moger will transcripts, Westcott and Stukeley family library files, Inquisition Post Mortem transcripts and the Record Office Personal Names Index. Unfortunately no relevant reference was found. In the light of the IGI entry for Stukeley Westcott at Great Torrington, Devon, he searched a transcript of the registers and Bishop's Transcripts for that parish (baptisms and marriages only) for the years 1597 to 1640 but failed to find any reference to either surname.

Look on your English map in South Somerset and find Crewkerne. Just 1 1/2 miles north you will find the village of Merriott. Not too far from Ilminster, Chard, Yeovil and Crinkley Bottom. (Britain's first TV theme park.)

GENERAL MEETING - 27 July 1996

Comfort Suites, Des Moines, IA

The meeting was called to order by President Morris at 9:05 a.m. and he welcomed those attending, stating a record number of family members were gathered for the reunion.

Chaplain Seyfarth led the group in prayer, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Vice-president Coltey.

A motion to approve the 1994 Meeting Notes, as distributed, was voted approved.

Treasurer Evelyn Hitchcock reported for 1994-96:

President Morris noted that the board felt cash flow adequate for the next two years and an increase in dues not necessary.

Historian Betty Acker reported that the Society has sent money to the 1st Baptist Church, Providence, RI, each year for a memorial Easter lily. The Westcott family trip to England next year is being planned and details will appear in The Quarterly. The board authorized placing of Society documents in a secure vault.

The Quarterly - President Morris read a letter from Pauline Dennis who was unable to attend the meeting, appreciation was expressed for Pauline's dedicated work in publishing The Quarterly. 1996 mailed ave. 450. An over-all average cost of \$.59 per copy.

Genealogist Edna Lewis was unable to attend. Her report, read by President Morris, indicated Volume III of the genealogy should go to press within the year, or so. There will probably be enough data for a fourth volume. Edna asked to be relieved of the Honorary Life Membership processing; the board voted to have this turned over to the Secretary.

Registrar - Lewis Westcott reported 102 new members have joined during 1994-96. We are nearing the 1000 mark! He announced the board's action creating a junior membership for applicants under 18.

Scholarship Loan Fund, reported by President Morris as Agent, has a cash balance slightly in excess of \$2000.00. There are still two delinquent recipients, whereabouts unknown. Loans are made interest free.

Revision of the By-laws: the board voted not to undertake a review of the By-laws. However, an amendment was approved establishing a single secretarial position.

Eleanor Wescott Trismen was SSWDA member # 309, an early member who spent many years working for the Society. She was national president, secretary, newsletter editor, and board member. Her scrap books kept from the 1940's, include news of the Westcott's in WWII as well as weddings, newspaper features, obituaries. They are kept with other important documents by the national historian. Eleanor did extensive genealogical research on her branch of the Westcott family. She was in demand by each new generation of officers for her guidance and wisdom.

TRISMEN — Eleanor Louise, August 2, 1902 to May 1, 1996. A native of Western New York State, she lived in River Edge since 1944. Her early art training was received at the Albright Art Gallery in Buffalo, NY and later at Columbia University graduating in 1927 with a degree in Fine Arts. While there, she was a member of Phi Kappa Gamma Sorority. After a brief study with Norman Rockwell, she became a textile designer with A. Sirooni Studio in New York City and later specialized in landscapes and miniature oils, often exhibiting with the Hackensack Art Association.
