The tour departs from <u>Boston</u>, Massachusetts on Thursday, September 18, 1997 and returns from Heathrow airport Monday, September 29.

First stop is Stonehenge, then on to Bath. The group will attend a Sunday worship service in St. John the Baptist Church in Yeovil, where Stukely Westcott and Julianna Marchante were married. Then to Plymouth, Exeter and Dartmoor, Britains southernmost National Park where prehistoric crosses and hut circles are common.

Visit Westcott Barton Pottery, Warwick Castle, the finest example of an English Castle, the Cotswolds. The trip ends with a tour of Oxford, London, and Greenwich.


STUKELY WESTCOTT, 1592 - 1677, planter and colonizer, one of the 13 original proprietors of Providence Plantations and Colony of Rhode Island; of Salem, Mass., 1635, Providence, R. L., 1638, and Warwick, R. L., 1647. His wife: Juliana Marchant. Their children: Damaris (Arnoid), Samuel, Robert, Amos, Mercy (Stafford), Jeremiah. In 1890 a Westcott Reunion was held at the cottage of Almon D. Westcott on Lake Chautauqua, New York. Frank Schruis, SSWDA member #560, shares with us the text of the speaker, Harriet Sill Marsh (Hattie), and a picture of those attending.

Remarks by Harriet Sill Marsh (Hattie) in 1890:

"In the town of Clarendon (Vermont), among the green mountains, six miles south of where Rutland now stands, there lived, in the eighteenth century, the first Westcotts of which any definite record is now known. They were of English descent ... At about the time when the French and Indian War was closing... more than twenty-five years before Vermont was made a state, and more than sixty five years before the celebrated Rutland marble began to be quarried... About this time there was born in Clarendon, Rutland county, Vermont, George W. Westcott." (Descendants of George Westcott and wife, Phebe Salisbury, migrated to New York and were at this reunion. Others, now members of SSWDA, went to Ohio, Iowa and west.)

She continues about those attending this reunion, "As to business or occupation there are fourteen farmers, one cheese and butter maker, one blacksmith, one tinner, one boarding house keeper, one dealer in coal, one in groceries, one in hardware, one druggist, one elocutionist, and one physician. The majority are farmers and some who are not wish they were.

None are rich as to goods of this world, but all have the comforts of life. They are credited with high and ennobling principles, honesty, sobriety, morality, truthfulness, justice, and common sense, a reverence for sacred things and the exercise of an intelligent faith." (George Wescott may be found in Whitman v.II p.143)

Westcott Bay Oysters

A small chain of San Francisco Bay area restaurants, The Fish Market, lists Westcott Bay oysters on its menu. From Rhode Island ?? No. <u>Lawrence Westcott</u> <u>Johnson reports</u>, Westcott Bay is in fact in the northwest corner of Washington state on San Juan Island, near Roche Harbor, an easy drive from Friday Harbor. Nearby is the English Camp portion of San Juan Islands National Historic Park. Here one of the last manifestations of England's effort to include more of the San Juan Islands for the British Empire resulted in the Pig War. We found Westcott

Drive, which led us to an oyster "farm" on the shore of placid Westcott Bay, where you get to pick your own. We enjoyed them barbecued that night. At the Fish Market's Palo Alto branch we learned that the Fish Market chain is part owner of the Westcott Bay oyster enterprise. We heartily recommend the pleasures of Friday Harbor, nearby Westcott Bay and Puget Sound area.
