## Family Bible of Marinda Wescott

I am in possession of a Bible that belonged to Marinda Wescott. An obituary was glued to the inside cover of the Bible. I've copied it to the best possible copy. The title of the obituary is: Two Veterans Fallen.

"Again has death removed from amongst us another of our old and very much respected residents. **Daniel Wescott** departed this life January 18<sup>th</sup>, in the 76<sup>th</sup> year of his age. The funeral services were held at the church on Sunday the 20<sup>th</sup>. Rev. C. J. Mott officiated. "Uncle Dan", as he was familiarly called, was born and always lived upon the farm where he died. Very early in life he experienced religion and united with the Methodist church of which he always remained a faithful member and nearly the whole time was an official member. Was a liberal contributor to the support of the Gospel and an efficient worker in the Master's vineyard.

Surely we shall all miss Uncle Dan, and remember his earnest prayers and exhortations, as he was very much gifted in prayer and exhortation. He leaves four sons and two daughters and a large circle of relatives and friends to mourn his loss.

And now his elder brother, **Rev. J. B. Wescott**, lies dead having been stricken with paralysis Jan. 31<sup>st</sup> and died Feb. in his 78<sup>th</sup> year. He was present at his brother's funeral two weeks ago. They were not long separated. Yes, Uncle Joe, every one called him, has gone to his reward and we shall miss him very much."

**Joseph B. Westcott** was b. in Peru, NY, 1811, d., 18 married Wealtha Bigelow. He was a Methodist minister. (Church is listed, Hattie.

**Daniel Westcott** b. Oct. 27, 1814. d. Jan 18, 1889, married 1<sup>st</sup> Meribah Calkins; married 2<sup>nd</sup> Mary. Resided Peru, NY. Eight children. Emily, John, Seth, Hiram, Benjamin, Webs Joseph, Abigail.

Joseph and Daniel were 2 of the 10 known chn. born to **Joseph Westcott** and **Olive Knight**. Joseph, b. 18 Aug 1763, in Old Middleboro, Mass. Served in the Albany Co. Militia during the Revolution. He moved around in Massachusetts; Bennington, Rutland, Monkton, Grand Isle, Vermont, and thence to Peru, NY where he died in 1857, aged 94 years.

Marinda, owner of this Bible, was a dau. of **Ira Westcott**, who was the son of Joseph Westcott and Olive Knight, therefore this Joseph and brother Daniel were her uncle's.

He married **Ezra Ricketson**.

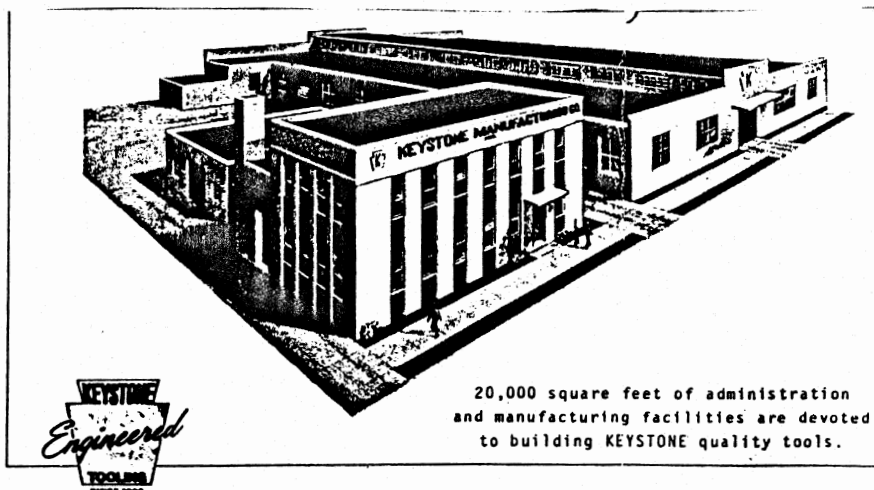

I HAVE BEEN UNABLE TO LOCATE ANY MORE DEFINITE INFORMATION THAN THE ABOVE ABOUT THE "WESTCOTT WRENCH". THIS PAGE WAS SUPPLIED BY THE BUFFALO & ERIE COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY AT BUFFALO, NY. IT APPEARS THAT THIS IS FROM A 1969 KEYSTONE CATALOG AND SAYS THAT THE WRENCH "HAS BEEN SAVING TIME, KNUCKLES AND TEMPER FOR SHOP MECHANICS, FARM AND HOUSE-HOLDERS FOR 60 YEARS". THIS WOULD PLACE THE INVENTION ABOUT 1909. DOES ANYONE KNOW MORE OF THE HISTORY OF THIS WRENCH?

FROM THE DESK OF YOUR SOCIETY HISTORIAN,

THE HOSKINSVILLE REBELLION  
NOBLE COUNTY, OHIO - MARCH 1863

THE TRIAL TOOK PLACE IN CINCINNATI IN APRIL, 1863. ONE OF THE SIXTEEN DEFENDANTS ON TRIAL WAS GORDON WESTCOTT.

IT ALL STARTED WITH A LETTER T.W. BROWN WROTE TO HIS COUSIN WESLEY McFARREN, WHO WAS A PRIVATE IN THE UNION ARMY, URGING HIM TO DESERT. MR. BROWN WAS SAID TO BE A TEACHER, BUT LATER TURNED OUT TO BE A SEVENTEEN YEAR OLD BOY.

THE LETTER FELL INTO THE HANDS OF THE MILITARY AFTER McFARREN ALLEGEDLY DESERTED. HE HAD GONE HOME, BUT MAYBE NOT AS A DESERTER. HE MAY HAVE BEEN PAROLED AFTER BEING CAPTURED WHILE OUT ON A PATROL.

THE U.S. MARSHALL IN CINCINNATI DISPATCHED FIVE SOLDIERS TO ARREST THE ALLEGED DESERTER. HOWEVER SOME 65 TO 100 ARMED RESIDENTS PROTECTED BROWN AND PREVENTED THE SOLDIERS FROM MAKING THE ARREST. THE MARSHALL THEN DISPATCHED SOME 200 ARMED SOLDIERS TO MAKE THE ARREST.

THE SMALL COMMUNITY OF HOSKINSVILLE IS IN SOUTHEASTERN OHIO, AND DURING THIS PERIOD SENTIMENT WAS PRETTY WELL DIVIDED REGARDING THE CIVIL WAR.

MOSES D. HARDY HAD REPRESENTED THIS DISTRICT IN THE OHIO STATE SENATE 1856-57 AND WAS A STRONG UNION SUPPORTER. UPON THE ARRIVAL OF THE SECOND EXPEDITION, HE GAVE AN AFFIDAVIT NAMING SOME 65 OF HIS NEIGHBORS WHO RESISTED THE FIRST EXPEDITION.

IN 1840, MOSES HARDY HAD MARRIED HANNAH WESTCOTT, DAUGHTER OF CHRISTOPHER WESTCOTT, WHO CAME FROM RHODE ISLAND IN 1816. LEWIS CASEY WESTCOTT WAS A BROTHER OF HANNAH. HE MARRIED CORDELIA HOWLAND, WHOSE MOTHER WAS A SISTER TO MOSES HARDY, MAKING MOSES HER UNCLE.

TO REALLY COMPLICATE MATTERS, GORDON WESTCOTT, ONE OF THE MEN ARRESTED, WAS THE YOUNGER BROTHER OF LEWIS CASEY AND HANNAH WESTCOTT. ALL OF THESE PEOPLE LIVED NEAR HOSKINSVILLE.

CAN YOU IMAGINE THE TANGLED EMOTIONS THAT MUST HAVE ENVELOPED THIS FAMILY?

EMOTIONS RAN SO HIGH THAT THE PEOPLE MOSES HAD NAMED, KNOWN AS "COPPERHEADS", BURNED MOSES D. HARDY'S BARN AND TOOK HIS WOOL. HANNAH WESTCOTT HARDY HAD DIED IN 1857 AND IN 1858 MOSES MARRIED AGAIN. EMILY, HIS SECOND WIFE, DIED IN 1866 FROM AN ILLNESS SAID TO HAVE BEGUN WITH OVEREXERTION WHILE TRYING TO FIGHT THE FIRE AND SAVE THE WOOL. MOSES HARDY SOLD HIS BELOVED FARM AND EVENTUALLY MOVED TO LACLEDE, LINN COUNTY, MISSOURI. HIS SON, LUCIUS, 20 YEARS OLD, DIED AT ANDERSONVILLE PRISON, JUNE 1864.

THE CASE AGAINST GORDON WESTCOTT WAS DISMISSED DUE TO LACK OF EVIDENCE. BY 1864, GORDON WESTCOTT AND HIS FAMILY WERE IN HARRISON COUNTY, MISSOURI.

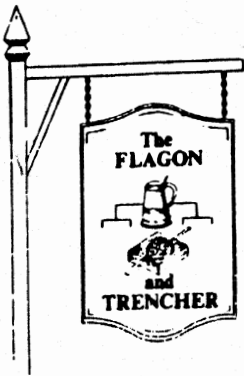

**THE OBJECTIVES OF THE SOCIETY:**

To establish the good repute of colonial tavern keepers through:
