Accept the Challenge

"Effort to determine the immediate ancestry of Stukely Westcott has resulted only in deductions. No definite record has been found."p.1 II Book of Appendices to the History and Genealogy of the Ancestors and Some Descendants of Stukely Westcott 1939, (hereafter referred to as vol.II).

"While it may be safely assumed that Westcott carried the blood of the Stucley family, positive evidence has not been found." vol.II p.5.

These are the words of Roscoe L. Whitman in his second book after researching all the material available to him in 1939 for evidence of the ancestors of Stukely Westcott. In reference to his Ancient English research into the Westcott and Stucley families he concludes, "Much of the data here presented is irrelevant to this history. vol.II p.5

Irrelevant because no documentation has been found to prove the parents of Stukely Westcott, nor the time or place where he was born. The sure thing is that he married Julian Marchant in St. John the Baptist Church at Yeovil in Somerset as recorded in the parish register there.

"May another compiler, at some future time, be more successful." vol .II p.x

In Search for the Passengers of the MARY and JOHN Volume 25 p.103 it was reported by Robin Bush, former Assistant Archivist of the Somerset County Record Office in Taunton, Somerset that while searching the Merriott manor court books (Somerset R.O DD/TMP Box 6) a 1607 reference was found to "Stukely Wescot" among a list of adolescents, on 24 Apr. 1616 to "Stukely Westcot" making default of suit to the manor court, and in a list of inhabitants in 1619 to "Stukely Wescot".

This shows there was a Stukely Westcott in Merriott from 1607 to 1619, but is it our Stukely Westcott? There was a Thomas Stukely, who was a trustee or

agent of the lord of Merriott manor (the Marquess of Dorset) in a copy of court roll dated 17 Oct. 1548. vol.25 p.103. Is this where the name Stukely comes from?

(See vol.25 p.70 for other records searched by Robin Bush at the West Country Studies Library and Devon Record Office in Exeter, Devon.)

And now in 2002, in the age of electronics, we have even more access to records here and in England. More original records have been microfilmed; more primary sources are available on the internet. Now is the time to accept the challenge of Roscoe Whitman, now is the future he spoke of, and we, the members of the SSWDA, are the compilers A good place to start is the Mormon Family History catalog online at http://familysearch.org. You will find films and books from all over the world. Browse the catalog here or at a local library connected to this LDS resource and order the film from the library or an LDS Family History Center There are hundreds of English records on film. In addition, look for Westcott in America. A search of the catalog web site shows 43 titles for Westcott and 12 for Wescott. Some key ones are:

JOHNNY CAKES or JONNY CAKES

HODE ISLAND is famous for Johnny Cakes, a delicacy no visitor should miss. In early colonial times they were known as "journey cakes," for they were usually packed in a traveler's knapsack as he set forth on a day's journey to a neighboring settlement. So, in these Plantations, they became Johny Cakes, for we drop the "h." And we make ours with white corn meal and cook them on a griddle, while elsewhere in New England they make them of yellow corn meal and bake them in the oven, And there's a vast difference.

Mrs. Barbara Wilbour Westcott, a great grand-daughter of the late Isaac C. Wilbour, a former State Senator from Little Compton and in 1806 acting Governor of the State has given us a precious recipe.

"Since Indian times," she has written, "my family have taken their own corn to the mill in Tiverton to be ground into meal. Until not too long ago the meal was ground by huge stones rotated by a water wheel. We took our dried corn to the mill and paid for the service in tare. This is the way we make our Jonny Cakes."

JONNY CAKES

- 2 cups Rhode Island Corn Meal (white corn meal, stone ground)
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 cups whole milk

Sift the meal, measure, add sugar and salt, and mix. Add the milk all at once and stir until smooth and free from lumps. Mixture should be thin enough to pour easily.

Heat iron griddle, greased with bacon drippings. When griddle is sizzling hot, pour on mixture. (About a tablespoon makes a cake.) Cook until brown on underside. Edges will be lacy and crisp.


Turn and brown on other side. Lightly grease griddle for each batch.

Serve piping hot with butter and maple syrup, or pour heavy cream over these cakes when used for main breakfast dish.
