There seems to be some misunderstanding about a consort receiving a life membership from the Society.

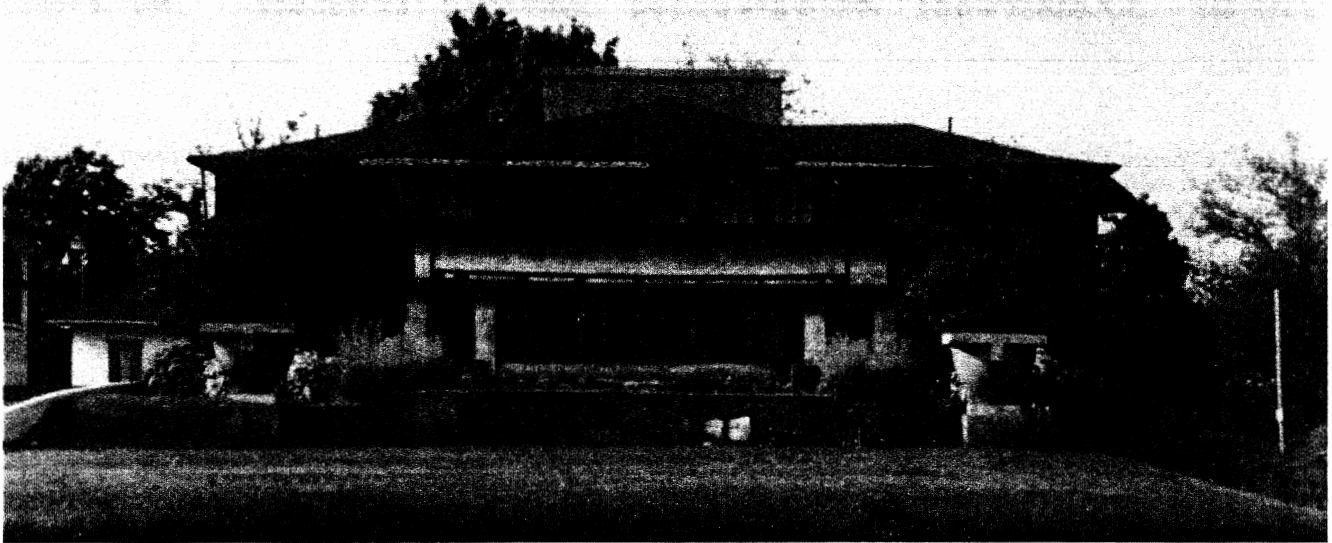
The SSWDA Constitution,

THE WESTCOTT HOUSE SPRINGFIELD, OHIO

The Frank Lloyd Wright-designed Westcott House took about two years and \$15,000 to build early in the 1900's. In 2002, according to the site manager for the Westcott House Foundation it will take 2-1/2 to three years and an estimated \$4.55 million to restore the Prairie Style mansion and its grounds to their former glory.

The house was built for Burton J. Westcott and his family. Frank Lloyd Wright lived with the family for a time to "get the feel of the family".

The "Prairie Style" home originally was a 12 room residence with five baths. The dining table and the entire buffet fixtures virtually folded into the wall. It is suggested that the two halves of the table were actually placed on top of each other and inserted into corresponding slots in the wall. The buffet totally disassembled and collapsed into drawers. The chairs probably also folded.

A fish pond in the front of the house and the large flower urns were distinctive features of the front of the house. The fish pond was filled in and became a flower bed.

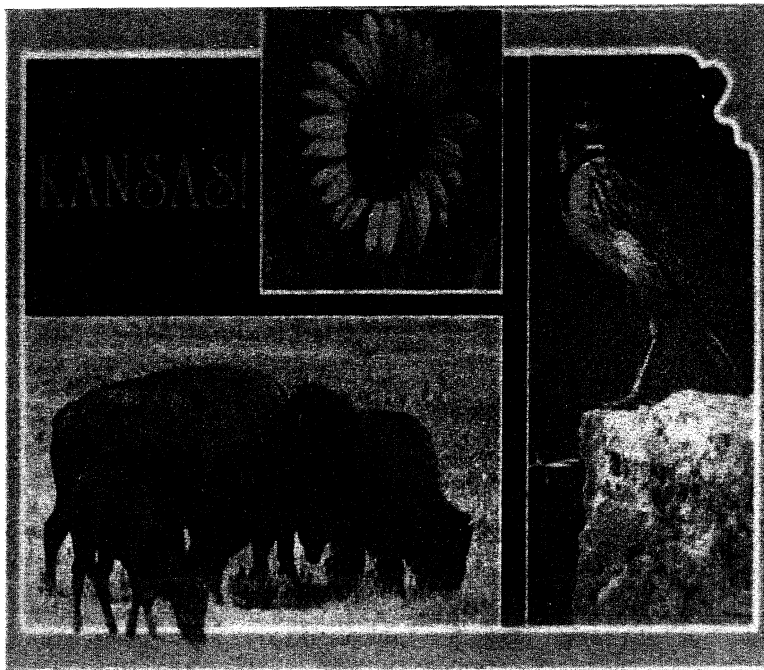
Downspouts do not appear on the exterior of the house. There was a 125-barrel cistern fed by the concealed downspouts. This water was for bathing and was fed into the tubs by a third spigot.

During World War I. the family tore up the tennis courts at the rear of the house to allow space for a "victory garden".

The house was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1974.

MINI-REUNION IN FALLS CHURCH, VIRGINIA

On May 24, 2003 a miniature Westcott Reunion was held at the Sir Walter Raleigh Restaurant in Falls Church, Virginia. This family branch involved represents the offspring of Aaron G. Johnson (1880-1973) and Ruth Westcott Johnson (1886-1971, no. 1285 in the Edna Lewis Genealogy). The 24-member group consisted of their surviving children (2), their grand-children (5), their great-grand-children (9), various in-laws (7), and a long-time neighbor and close friend. Westcott appears as the middle name for four of their living and deceased descendants.

Aaron and Ruth were both born and raised in South Dakota, but had made their home in Madison, Wisconsin; Washington, D.C.; and Arlington, Virginia. The attendees reside in a pattern scattered across the country; four are from Andover, Massachusetts; four from Falls Church, Virginia; two from Grove City, Pennsylvania; three from the Denver area; four from Caldwell, Idaho; and six from the San Francisco Bay area. The guest of honor was Lewis R. Johnson of Westminster, Colorado, a charming and active senior who achieved the age of 90 just five weeks earlier.

The idea for this get-together surfaced during a similar but much smaller reunion in Denver, Colorado, in October, 2002. The basic suggestion was made by Elizabeth R. J. Mamer of Caldwell, Idaho, and the principal organizer was Peter M. Chase of Falls Church, Virginia. He accepted the main workload as a consequence of being located in the chosen area, and carried out the necessary procedures efficiently and without complaint.

"48222 MAIL BY THE PAIL"

Out on the Detroit River, halfway between the U.S. and Canada, a crewman on the deck of the mailboat *J. W. Westcott II* lowers a bucket on the end of a rope and then hoists up the bag of U.S. mail that has been swiftly attached by the crew of the *Westcott*. So goes one more postal delivery in 48222, the zip code reserved for freighter crews on the Great Lakes, who pick up their mail as they pass this spot. When the boat's namesake, John Ward Westcott began delivering messages to passing ships in 1874, he had only two oars and a strong back. On October 23, 2001, just before dawn, the *Westcott* was headed for an oceangoing tanker a "salty" - moving upriver. But the tanker did not slow down, and, in circumstances that are still unclear, the *Westcott* was suddenly flipped over. It sank in seconds, drowning the crew of two - Cathy Nasiatka, the experienced captain, and deckhand Dave Lewis. (The *Westcott* has since been refloated and repaired.)

BEE BUDDY

"IF YOU DO NOTHING, THE COLONY WILL BE DEAD WITHIN THREE YEARS.

A message from outer space? No, it's just one of the e-mails Austin L. Westcott of Kingsville Township, Ohio zaps almost daily to members of the 4-H group to which Austin is adviser.

He's talking about honey bees, a subject that has fascinated the 94-year-old beekeeper since 1925. Westcott says he was a high school student working his

summer vacation on the Bert "Happy" Harrison Fruit and Vegetable Farm when he first became interested in bees. One day in late May, we saw a swarm of bees in a tree," Austin says. "I helped him get a ladder and a new hive, then stood a short distance away and watched him put the swarm in the hive. A few days later, I found a swarm. He was not at home, so I captured it. No stings, so that was really something different. I really was quite proud of my accomplishment, and from then on beekeeping has been quite enjoyable."

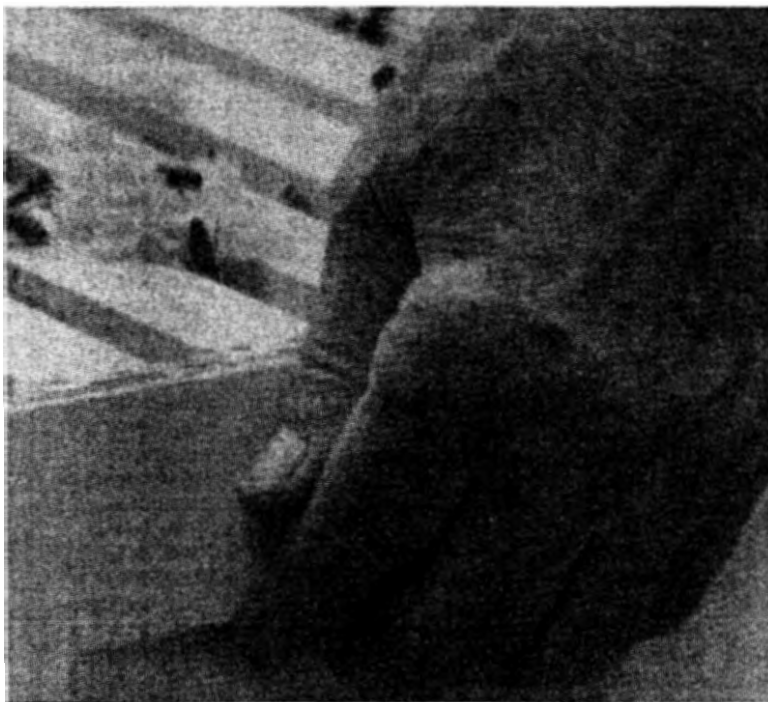
Austin spent 20 years working on Great Lakes freighters, then started his own business, The Kingsville Basket Factory, which operated from 1955 to 1974. After he retired, he got into honey production in a major way.

"I had bees off and on before, and I liked them," he says. "It is one of the greatest things for retirement because you control your product. With fruit trees, the older they get, the more work they require, and the older a retired person gets, the less work they want to do."

In Austin's heyday as a beekeeper, 1980-95, he had more than 100 colonies and sold honey by the ton to Bowdler's Market in Ashtabula, Ohio. He also was the state's largest producer of queen bees, about 200 a year, including those for his own hives. Austin says he learned beekeeping from others in the field and by reading the bible on the subject, "ABC and XYZ of Bee Culture." In its 40th edition, it's a book Austin still recommends for any budding beekeeper. One to share his passion for bees, Austin has served as adviser to numerous 4-H groups over the years. It has helped renew Austin's interest in life. He checks his hives and listens to the weather forecast every day so he can alert his junior beekeepers to

any special steps they should take to protect their colonies. He disseminates the information via e-mail.

For retired gentlemen like Austin Westcott, the bee gives them a reason to get out of bed, get dressed and live another day at whatever pace suits them.
