

Paul W. Westcott 1928-2006

Paul W. Westcott, President of the Society since 2004, passed away at home on January 21, 2006 after a brief illness.

Paul was born in Oneida, New York on January 10, 1928. He graduated from high school in Oswego, and studied engineering at the University of Cincinnati for a year. Paul graduated from Niagara County Community College in 1976 with an associate degree in applied science.

Paul worked as a designer of scuba regulators and breathing systems, including the emergency breathing apparatus used by the Apollo astronauts. He spent more than 10 years working at Scott Aviation in Lancaster, and then joined Sherwood SelPac in Lockport. He retired from the latter company in 1983 after serving 20 years.

Elected president of the Society in July 2004, Paul was also a past master of the Tonawanda Lodge 247, Free & Accepted Masons and a member and

elder of First Presbyterian Church in Tonawanda. He was a director of Nine Mile Island Youth Camp and also served as a scoutmaster of Boy Scout Troop 570 in Tonawanda.

Paul resided in the Tonawandas for over 50 years. He belonged to the Niagara-Orleans Model Engineers and enjoyed making model railroads, and was also a photographer.

Paul is survived by his wife of 55 years, the former Barbara H. Milliman; his sons Paul; of Ft. Lauderdale, Florida and Jeffrey, of Livermore, California; his daughter Connie Stirling, of Minneapolis, Minnesota; a sister, Donna Ottaviani, of Akron: and grandchildren, Brenden, Kyle, Paul G., Melinda, April, Brittany, Jonathan and Carolyn.

Paul was a warm, wonderful man with an infectious sense of humor who will be sorely missed by all of his cousins in the Society.

Evelyn Hitchcock, Society Treasurer



Evelyn Pickens Hitchcock

Born December 21, 1917 Arcade, N.Y.

Died peacefully with family at her bedside January 9, 2006 Brockport, N.Y.

Preceded in death by her parents Dr. George and Linda (Wagoner) Pickens; sister Frances Pickens Kuhn; niece Judith Evelyn Kuhn. Survived by son Dana (Skip) Matteson; daughter Linda Hitchcock Mault; Grandchildren Sara Evelynn Matteson-Rusby, Aimee Cheryl VanBortle; Michael Mault, Casey Mault; niece, Jean Brundage; nephews Jerald Kuhn, James Kuhn.

Evelyn was born and raised in Arcade, NY, moving to Brockport, NY in June, There she operated Hitchcock 1950. Jewelers with husband Lucius Hitchcock, becoming the sole owner in 1970, making extensive changes in the business management and store design. She closed the store in December, 1989 retiring after 40 years. She was proud to have served as the first president of the Downtown Merchants Association of Brockport during its formative years.

Evelyn joined the Order of the Eastern Star in 1936, becoming a Life Member of Mary Jane Holmes Chapter, Brockport, N.Y.

In 1947, Evelyn joined the Hendershott Manness Ladies Auxiliary to Veterans of Foreign Wars in Arcade, N.Y. on the service of her husband. For 58 years, until her passing, she devoted much of her time to working with Veterans and their causes, and was a Life Member of the VFW. In 1951, she served as the first president of the Lt. Rodney H. Dobson Auxiliary in Brockport. Evelyn served as President of Monroe County Auxiliary in 1954, and was elected to serve as NYS Auxiliary President from 1963 to 1964 – a highlight of her service to VFW. She was elected to represent NYS on the board of Directors of the National VFW Auxiliary from 1967 to 1969, and served on the National level as Buddy Poppy Chairman in 1969, and National Home Fund Chairman in 1970. (The V.F.W. National Home for Children provides a home for children of needy and disabled veterans.)

Evelyn was very proud of her heritage, and spent a great deal of time with family matters relating to genealogy. She was a descendant from her Father's family of Stukely Westcott, who came to this country in 1635 from England, and who, together with Roger Williams, was one of 13 original proprietors in the colony of Rhode Island. Evelyn is an Honorary Life Member of the Society of Stukely Westcott Descendants of

America (founded June 12, 1934) and served as Treasurer of the national organization from 1992 to the present.

From her Mother's family, Evelyn is a descendant of Daniel Frederick Bakeman (1760 – 1869) the last surviving pensioner of the American Revolution. Evelyn became a member of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution in October, 1969, Mary Jamison Chapter, Warsaw, N.Y.

During funeral services held, January 13, 2006, at St. Luke's Church, Brockport, granddaughters Sara and Aimee each presented moving tributes.
