Richard "Dick" Bruckman



Richard "Dick" Allen Bruckman, passed away Tuesday, February 4, 2014 on his 79th birthday at Mercy Medical Center, due to complications following surgery.

A visitation will be held from 5:00-7:00 PM. Friday, February 7 at Hamilton's Southtown Funeral Home, 5400 SW 9th Street, Des Moines. Funeral services will be held at 10:30 AM Saturday, February 8 at Carlisle United Methodist Church, 405 School Street in Carlisle, Iowa. Burial will be at a later date in Ohio.

Dick was born on February 4, 1935 in Saybrook, Ohio, son of Vernon and Boneda (Cummings) Bruckman. He graduated from Kingsville High School in Ohio. After attending Rio Grande College, he returned to Kingsville to teach high school math and coach from 1957-1964. He then accepted a position with Diamond Alkali, which brought his family to Iowa in 1966, settling in Carlisle. Over the years, Dick was a New York Life insurance agent, was employed at Wright Chevrolet, Reed Cadillac-Olds, and most recently Staples.

Dick's love of the outdoors included gardening, hunting, fishing, bee keeping and picking berries. He earned the Bridge Life Master Certificate in 2009. He proudly served as President of the Carlisle School Board and was instrumental in sanctioning the Carlisle Little League. He was an all-around athlete and avid sports fan who cheered loudest for his Cubs.



Lawrence W. Johnson:





Lawrence W. Johnson a Hewlett Packard materials engineer, has died at age 89. He died on March 22, at peace in his home in Los Altos, with his children at his side, surrounded by the jazz music he loved.

Larry was born in 1924 and grew up in Washington D.C., son of Dr. Aaron G. Johnson, a Dept. of Agriculture cereal crops scientist and Ruth M. (Westcott) Johnson, a studied

pianist and loving homemaker. At an early age he began riding the trolley car to the local music store at the bottom of Rodman Street to purchase mono singles of the budding jazz genre. He would continue to collect singles, LP's and eventually CD s till his final days.

He went to school at Alice Deal Jr. High, then Woodrow Wilson High School, where even in the early days his inquisitive nature had him and his friends building Tesla coils in class. He joined the cadets, played cello, and graduated in 1942. In

1942, Larry received a Westinghouse Cooperative Scholarship enabling his attendance at Carnegie Institute of Technology (now Carnegie Mellon University). It was in his freshman year that the love of electricity 'burned energetically in his heart; he wrote in a note to a college friend. Vacuum tubes circuits caught his eye. WWII got in the way, and after basic training in Florida, he was chosen to spend two quarters at Stanford University as part of the Army Special Training Program, studying electrical engineering. He served at Oceanside, San Luis Obispo, Monterrey and the Presidio in San Francisco before being discharged in 1946, when he returned to college to finish his degrees. He graduated with a BS (Physics) '48 and a MS (EE) '49.

Larry worked on Carnegie's 200-inch cyclotron project in Saxonburg, PA, where he met Isabel Beck, daughter of Pennzoil Oil refiner, John Beck. They were married in 1947. Their happiness was brief, unfortunately, when Isabel passed away in 1955. Now a widower and footloose, Larry, who had been working for Bendix in York, PA, took interest in moving back west. He started working for Hewlett Packard in 1956.

He worked in oscilloscopes, and later moved to Materials Management and the world of semi-conductors, creating a team that developed HP's company-wide 'Preferred Parts Listing' which was innovative and revolutionary for the time. He retired from HP after 30 enjoyable years as a Materials Engineer, and later worked in the same capacity at Trimble Navigation, eventually retiring 3 more times.

It was at HP that Larry met the love of his life, Esther (Wilson) Hanson, a young widow herself with a young son, Brad. They married in 1957 and built their first of three Los Altos houses. They shared 54 years together until Esther passed at home in 2011. Theirs was a charmed union, full of love, family, travel, corgis, and beach houses. He was very proud of his wife, children and grandchildren, and loved spending time with his HP retiree friends.

Larry had lived in Los Altos for 57 years at the time of his passing, and was a member of The HP Retired Employees Club, Beta Theta Pi fraternity, and the Society of Stuckely Westcott Descendants.

Predeceased by brother Lewis R. Johnson, sisters Elizabeth W. Johnson and Marian Chase, Larry is survived by three children and five grandchildren; son Douglas S. Johnson of Mountain View (Alexander, Victoria, Jack, all of Sunnyvale); daughter, Elizabeth R. J. M. Mamer (Phillip) of Caldwell, ID (Duncan, Annapolis, MD, and Derrick, Moscow, ID); and stepson Bradley W. Hanson of Cobb, CA. A gathering to celebrate Larry's life will be held on April 27th at 2pm at the family home in Los Altos. A private ceremony for the scattering of ashes of both Larry and Esther over Monterrey Bay will happen in early summer.

FROM THE ALASKA NATIVE NEWS: DOES ANYONE KNOW THIS WESTCOTT "COUSIN"?

Gene Wescott, a Professor Emeritus of Geophysics and long-time employee at the UAD Geophysical Institute, died in Hawaii on Feb. 23, 2014. He had been with the GI since 1958. He conducted pioneering work on "sprites" – the mysterious optical flashes that occur above thunderstorms – in the mid 1990s, with fellow GI researchers Davis Sentman and Daniel Osborne. The team captured sprites on video, providing conclusive evidence of the phenomena.

Wescott also participated in activities related to two international polar years (1957-1958 and 2007-2009) during his time with the institute. He retired in 1997, but like many GI scientists, continued to work on projects and kept an office at the facility. Wescott hitchhiked to Alaska from Boulder, Colorado, in 1958 after writing to the Geophysical Institute Director Christian T. Elvey about a position. He left for Alaska before getting a response. He landed a job in Denali National Park, but once the job ended, he began his career at the GI as a research assistant. He earned both his master's degree and a Doctorate from UAF, in 1960 and 1964 respectively.

"I came up to climb mountains, and I knew there was a Geophysical Institute there where I might get a summer job after climbing," Wescott said in a 2007 interview. With the exception of a three-year leave of absence at NASA and a sabbatical or two, Gene Wescott dedicated nearly 50 years to the GI and UAF research endeavors. Wescott was 82.

Hello friends and family:

We just wanted to let you know that we are in Soufli, Greece near the Turkish border. Soufli was once an important silk production town. Today, a fabulous museum tells the history. Of course, being on the adventure of the Silk Road, we had to stop here.

Tomorrow, Friday, we are headed into Turkey. This should give us enough time to take care of the paper work for leaving the truck in a government compound (mandatory) while leaving the country for a month. We also visit the Espar dealer in Istanbul because our D5 Hydronic hot water heater decided to quit. If we can do this before we leave, he can order spare parts if need be while we are in the States. Other things we need to start looking into is visas for the countries between Turkey and China. We have heard it's easier to do this in Istanbul than further on but we have to be careful because often times, visas are only valid for three months from the time issued to the time you have to get to the country.

It looks like we'll be entering China August 28 from Kirgystan across the Taklamakan desert, then Xian (Terra Cotta warriors) all the way to the Yellow Sea, back to Beijing. We will exit China September 29 into Mongolia. From there....only Zeus knows....

Next, the First Baptist Church in Providence was founded by Roger Williams and his followers. The first named was Stuckely Westcott.

A project is underway that will possibly result with a historical marker being placed at the Stuckely Westcott home site and burial ground. More on this later.
